



- Create a planning tool for all agencies




A. Station #1 Missing Links - West Section

- 1. I'd like to be able to bike from Coalton to Eldorado.
- 2. Dillon Road between McCaslin Blvd. and 88th St. needs connection for Bike Lanes.
- 3. 96th and Independence Road needs bike lanes.
- 4. South Boulder Rd. Louisville to Lafayette no on-street bike lane markings, lacking trail connections, limited to on-street.
- 5. Link 75th Street to the soft surface path located directly to the east.
- 6. There is no shoulder on Arapahoe Road and 95th Street.
- 7. There are missing links and conflicts with right turn lanes on S. Boulder Rd.
- 8. Missing Link (Bike lane) on the Northeast corner of Arapahoe and 75th (going north on 75th).
- 9. No more bike paths in a squiggle shape (need direct routes).
- 10. The Marshall Drive route is a good existing route but the connection to the shoulder on US-36 is a missing link.
- 11. Dillon Road: No good way to connect from Coal Creek Trail. Also need Multi-use path to 96th St.
- 12. Marshall Road: add shoulders from Cherryvale to US-36
- 13. Corridor through Storage Tek would be a great route. But is it a private street? Would it require a grant authorization?
- 14. US-36 is a major barrier between communities to north and south, very few good connections.
- 15. I would like to have a facility connecting Baseline Road east of Baseline reservoir to Louisville reservoir. 76th to Louisville reservoir is county open space and a power line exists for the corridor.
- 16. I commute on McCaslin and would like more connecting facilities.
- 17. Arapahoe Road, add bike facility to extend east to 287.
- 18. Missing link: S. Boulder Road and 95th Street

BT4: 14TH AVENUE TO COUNTRY ESTATES PARK

PROPOSED LOCATION:

14th Avenue east of Main Street to Community Ditch, and Community Ditch to Aspen Creek Park

SURROUNDING LAND USES:

Single Family Homes

CURRENT SURFACE:

Asphalt and Soft Surface

RECOMMENDED FACILITY:


Signed bicycle route on 14th Avenue and 10' concrete pathway plus jogging strip on the ditch corridor with appropriate wayfinding, regulatory signage (see intersection improvements #16 and #34).





Provide a signed bicycle route on 14th Avenue to the community ditch corridor and a paved connection on the community ditch corridor to Aspen Creek Park.







Anthem-State Highway 7 Regional Trail (3.5 miles)

 Connections to: Lafayette, Erie, Coal Creek Trail, Rock Creek Trail, and I-25






